Exploring our Community Garden and the Language of Food

From Garden to Plate

With winter upon us, we will be exploring herbs and vegetables that grow in the cooler months. Children will be involved in planting seeds and maintaining the garden including watering the plants. They will harvest produce to use in cooking experiences and help wash, chop and mix ingredients. Involving children in these activities not only teaches them about gardening and healthy eating but also fosters a sense of responsibility and curiosity when engaging in their natural environment.

We will continue to explore the importance of food and the way that it brings us together as a community. Cooking activities will provide a wonderful springboard for discussions and opportunities for children to hypothesise, plan, experiment, test, reflect, draw conclusions and share their learning. Our brand new industrial kitchen will inspire new cooking experiences and food investigations.

Investigating Literacy and STEM

During Vacation Care, we will build on and extend vocabulary through a range of stories and introduce new words in the context of our investigations, play and activities. Oral, written and digital storytelling will be explored in order to continue to support and extend children's literacy skills. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) learning experiences will be set up across the ELC promoting the development of critical thinking, problem-solving skills and children's collaboration.

Exploring the Hundred Languages – Supporting Creativity

In the Atelier and across the Centre, the children will be invited to express themselves using different artistic languages such as clay, graphic language, painting, open-ended materials, photography, music and dance. The children will continue to learn about the role of an architect and the endless possibilities of designing and building. We will continue our music program with the opportunity for children to engage with music of various types and tempo, objects that make sounds and musical instruments.

Our Natural Environment

Our outdoor environment will continue to inspire curiosity and endless learning opportunities. The children will continue to connect with nature, exploring our outdoor veranda facing Ferguson Park. The space will become a laboratory where children can research, using their senses.

Children will be invited to be botanists and to investigate the scientific characteristics and Kaurna names of the native plants living in Ferguson Conservation Park. Using binoculars, we will invite them to observe birds and other local fauna and record their wonderings with graphic material.



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Wellbeing and Movement

We know the integral role that the natural environment provides for our wellbeing. With a focus on emotional regulation, we will continue to foster children's capacity to identify, name and understand their emotions and feelings. We will continue our regular gross motor program as well as engage in outside activities. Children will participate in cooperative games that involve them experimenting with speed, directionality and large muscle movements.

Billing and Charges

Vacation Care runs from 7.30am – 6pm Rate per child per day: \$150

No payment is taken during this online booking process. All bookings made will be charged to your ELC account, similar to term time. Where eligible, the Child Care Subsidy is applied to Vacation Care bookings.

As ELC Vacation Care staffing and catering are based on bookings, please book by **Thursday 27 June 2024 (Week 9)**. Due to limited spaces during Vacation Care, please book early. Any bookings and changes made after this date will incur a late booking fee of \$5 added on top of the daily rate per child. Any cancellations must be communicated to us at least <u>24 hours</u> in advance. Late cancellations will result in the full fee being charged for your booking.

What to Bring to Vacation Care

During Vacation Care, children are required to wear their ELC uniform to support consistency and continuity throughout the school year.
