About the Role

St Peter's Girls' School provides several personalised bus routes Adelaide Hills, Central (City), Dernancourt, Mawson Lakes, Southern, West Lakes, Blackwood, Glenelg, Golden Grove and North East to collect students in the morning (from their designated location) and drop them off after school (to their designated location).

The Bus Driver reports to the Transport Manager on all the daily operations of the bus service provided to students by the School. All drivers must operate and comply with the Bus Driver Guide Manual provided to them, and each driver must acknowledge the same.

It is the Bus Driver's responsibility to maintain their allocated bus to a good operational standard, including checking oil, coolant and brake fluid levels regularly. All lights, tyres and external areas of the buses need to be checked daily. Drivers are to refuel their bus when at half or less and not to allow the bus to run short of fuel.

Drivers are required to maintain the cleanliness of their bus by washing the exterior regularly including on team scheduled cleaning days. The interior of buses is to be cleaned after each morning and afternoon shift. Rubbish bins should be emptied, the floors swept and a check around the seats for items left behind. Interior windows should be cleaned at least weekly along with the bus windscreen and rear-view mirrors.

Drivers are to strictly adhere to the School Uniform Policy, including wearing appropriate flat-soled footwear.

Each bus is supplied with a mobile telephone for parents to contact the driver about collecting or dropping off their daughter(s), should any changes occur. During school terms, Bus Drivers work a split-shift arrangement providing morning and afternoon services to drive students to and from School.
